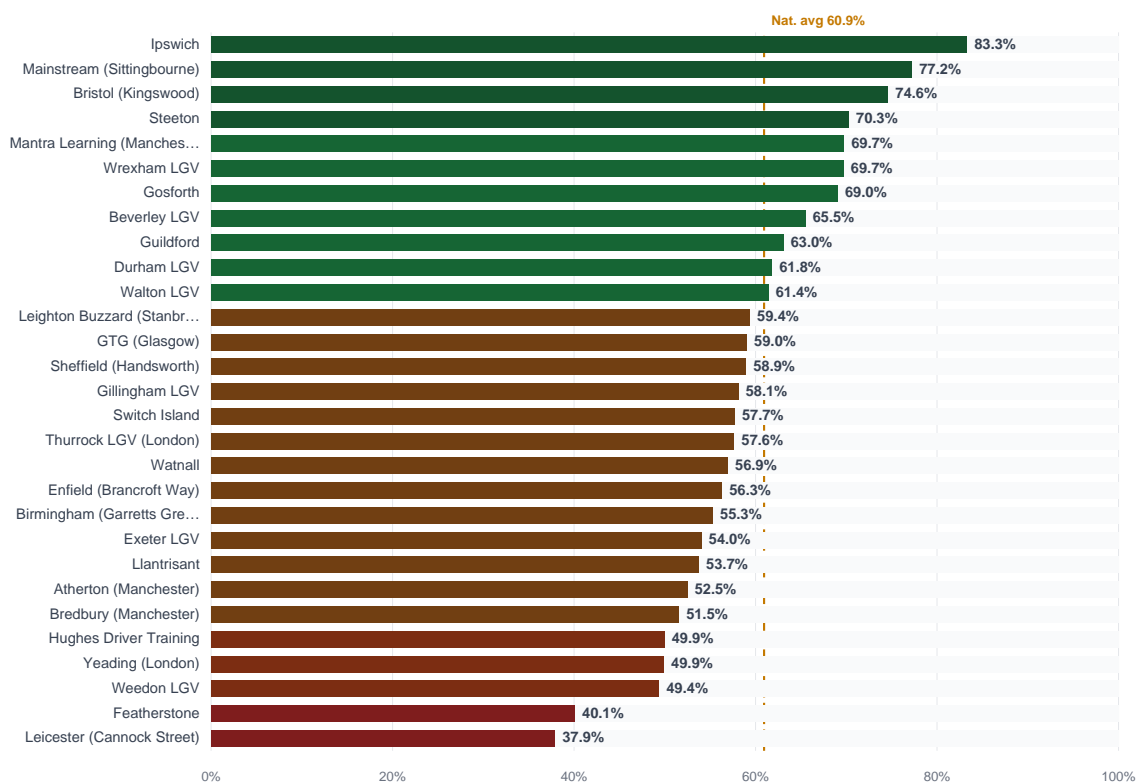
## Overview

This report presents the official DVSA on-road LGV practical driving test statistics for the 2024–25 financial year, drawn directly from dataset DRT322B. It covers all test centres across Great Britain that conducted 700 or more LGV tests during the period, encompassing licence categories C, C1, C+E and C1+E.

Across all 29 qualifying centres a combined total of **43,408 tests** were conducted, of which **24,834 resulted in a pass**. The national on-road LGV pass rate for 2024–25 was **60.9%** (42,432 passes from 69,633 tests). Note that the national figure includes centres not listed here — those with fewer than 700 tests or where only a single examiner conducted tests (suppressed by DVSA policy).

**Ipswich** recorded the highest pass rate among qualifying centres at **83.3%** (976 passes from 1,172 tests), while **Leicester (Cannock Street)** recorded the lowest at **37.9%** (563 passes from 1,486 tests) — a spread of 45.4 percentage points. By volume, **Yeading (London)** was the busiest qualifying centre with 3,869 tests, followed by Featherstone (3,379) and Leighton Buzzard (2,456).

## Pass Rate by Test Centre (2024–25)








Centres ordered by pass rate (highest to lowest). Dashed gold line = national average (60.9%).
